Annual Conference

Each year the EGPP hosts an annual conference that focuses on a crucial theme for the European Union. In 2022, the conference was 'Representation in flux and the future of democratic innovations'.

Ukraine mini-series

The EGPP has organised a series of seven seminars in May-June 2022 discussing the impact of the war in Ukraine on several aspects of European integration: military and security, finance and trade, energy dependence and transition to renewable sources, migration, prospect of enlargement and new accession processes, as well as European identity feelings and support for EU policy coordination. This seminar series provided the forum for an academic assessment of these transformations and of their possible future directions.

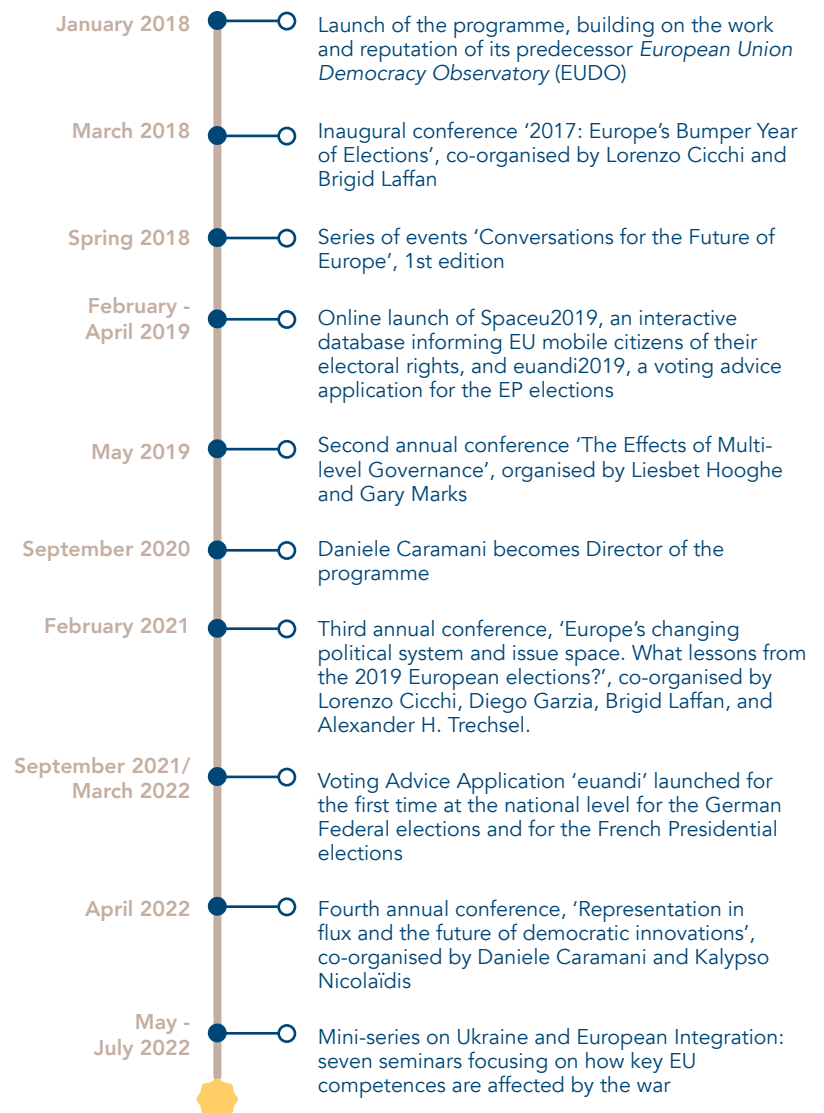
